Green Wedge Blackwell Grange Parkland: AP20. Council to amend the policies map to extend the Green Wedge designation so that it corresponds to the boundary of the Parkland with the built up area to the West and North. (Grangeside Blackwell Lane, Upsall Drive and Grange Road).

Alterations to Blackwell/Skerne Park and Haughton/Red Hall Green Wedge boundaries Retain the openness and green infrastructure functions of:

The green wedges of Cocker Beck/Mowden, Blackwell/Skerne Park and Haughton/Red Hall. Policy to protect and enhance the landscape character, setting and identity of the area.

This parkland is essential for me and my family and community's wellbeing - physical and mental as well as emotional. It is a beautiful, accessible opportunity to have peace, fresh air and enjoyment of the natural woodland, hedges and wildlife, of which there is a wide variety depending on this land for survival. The trees in particular are vital for us to maintain in Darlington for our contribution to the survival of the planet for our descendants.

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I believe it is imperative that the green areas are retained and that not housing or building rights are granted to anyone for ownership and development of the Green Wedge to its boundaries and also the triangle for Blands Corner.
